- 268 **Apologies for absence** – None
- 269 **Declaration of interests** - All members of Etwall Parish Council attending this meeting, being automatically Trustees of Frank Wickham Hall Charity, declared their interest.
- 270 **Election of Chairman** – Cllr Neal was proposed and elected as Chairman.
- 271 **Election of Vice-Chairman** – Cllr Adcock was proposed and elected as Vice-Chairman.
- 272 **Minutes of the meeting held on 27<sup>th</sup> April 2015** – Already approved at full Council meeting.
- 273 **Public Speaking** – Further to the public meeting, the point was made that even if only the first phase of development on Willington Road went ahead, a new road which could take some traffic away from the Willington Road/Main Street junction onto Egginton Road, would be a benefit.
- 274 **Willington Road Phase 2 – Response to SDDC** – The comment was made that the latest version of the Local Plan was not available on the SDDC website. The Clerk to write to SDDC. Replies had been received from Heather Wheeler stating that she had organised a meeting with senior representatives of SDDC and the Secretary of State regarding the Local Plan.
- IT WAS DECIDED to object to the Willington Road Phase 2. Comments were made about Lawn Avenue and Burnaston Lane being used as “rat runs”, traffic at school times, Willington Road being a bus route and part of it being in a Conservation Area preventing the road being widened as well as the site not being included in the Local Plan.
- 275 **Egginton Road/Willington Road Link Road** – It was felt that this would be of benefit although no-one wanted the additional housing that this road would bring.
- 276 **Planning applications to be considered** – None. It was reported that the following applications had been approved:-
- Extension and alterations at 90 Belfield Road
  - Sign at Dental Surgery, Main Street
  - Pruning of trees at Grove Park
  - Additional storage space at Hansons Auctioneers
  - Extension at 1 Lawn Avenue

277 **Provision of Village Facilities** – If 106 monies became available, ideas for benefits to the village included a new cemetery, a skatepark, a satellite doctor’s surgery. Cllr Patten reported that the SDDC Scrutiny Commttee were looking at payments from developers towards improving medical facilities.

Cllr Bennett reported that he had met with Ian Hey at SDDC regarding funding for improvements at the village hall. IT WAS DECIDED that Cllr Bennett would arrange for Ian Hey to meet with members to discuss possible funding.
